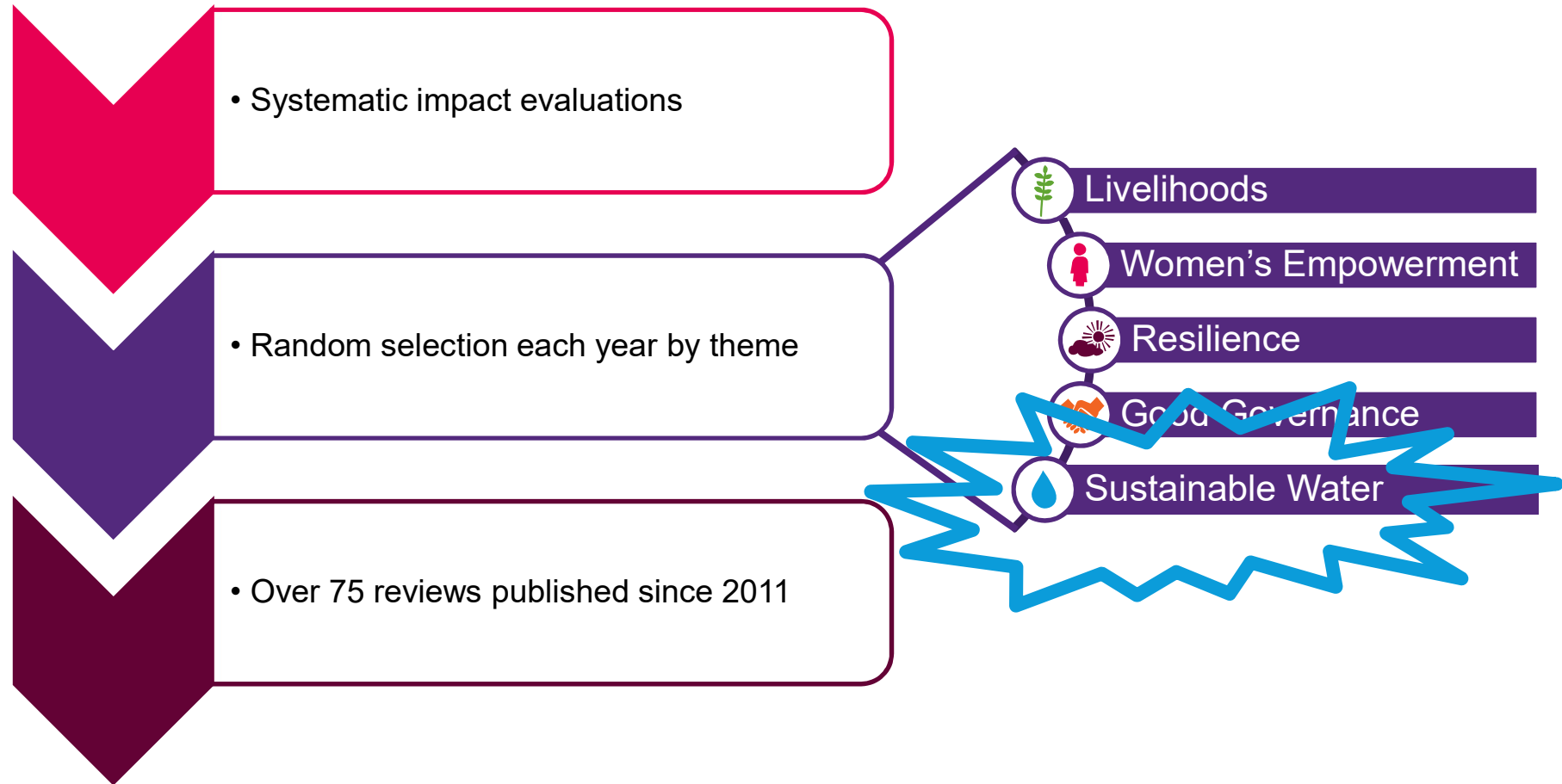

34 villages, N=1071

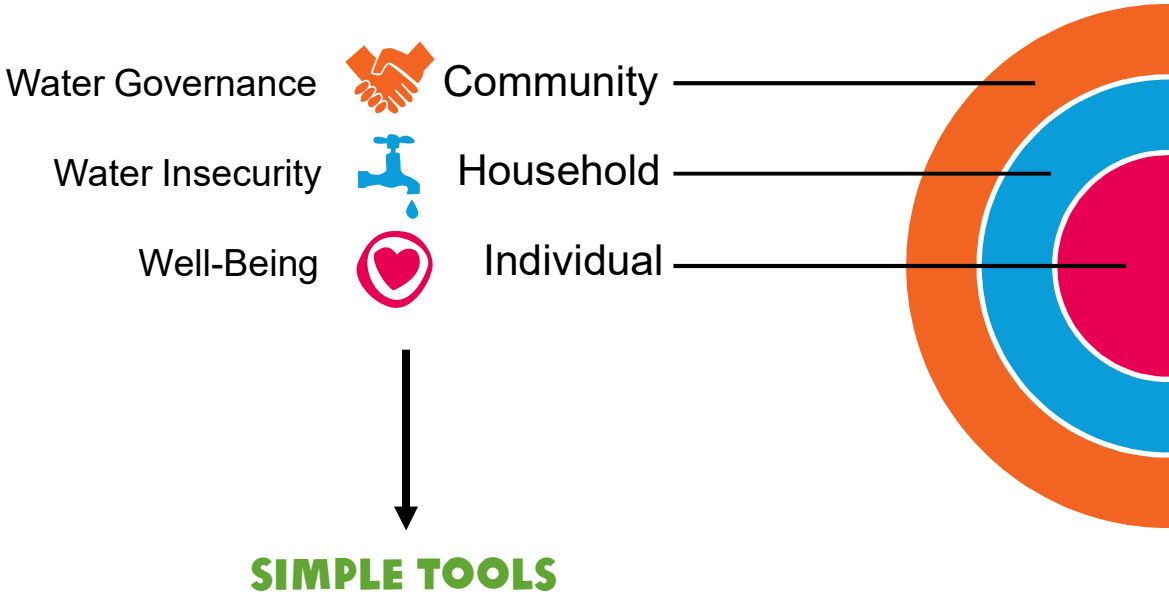

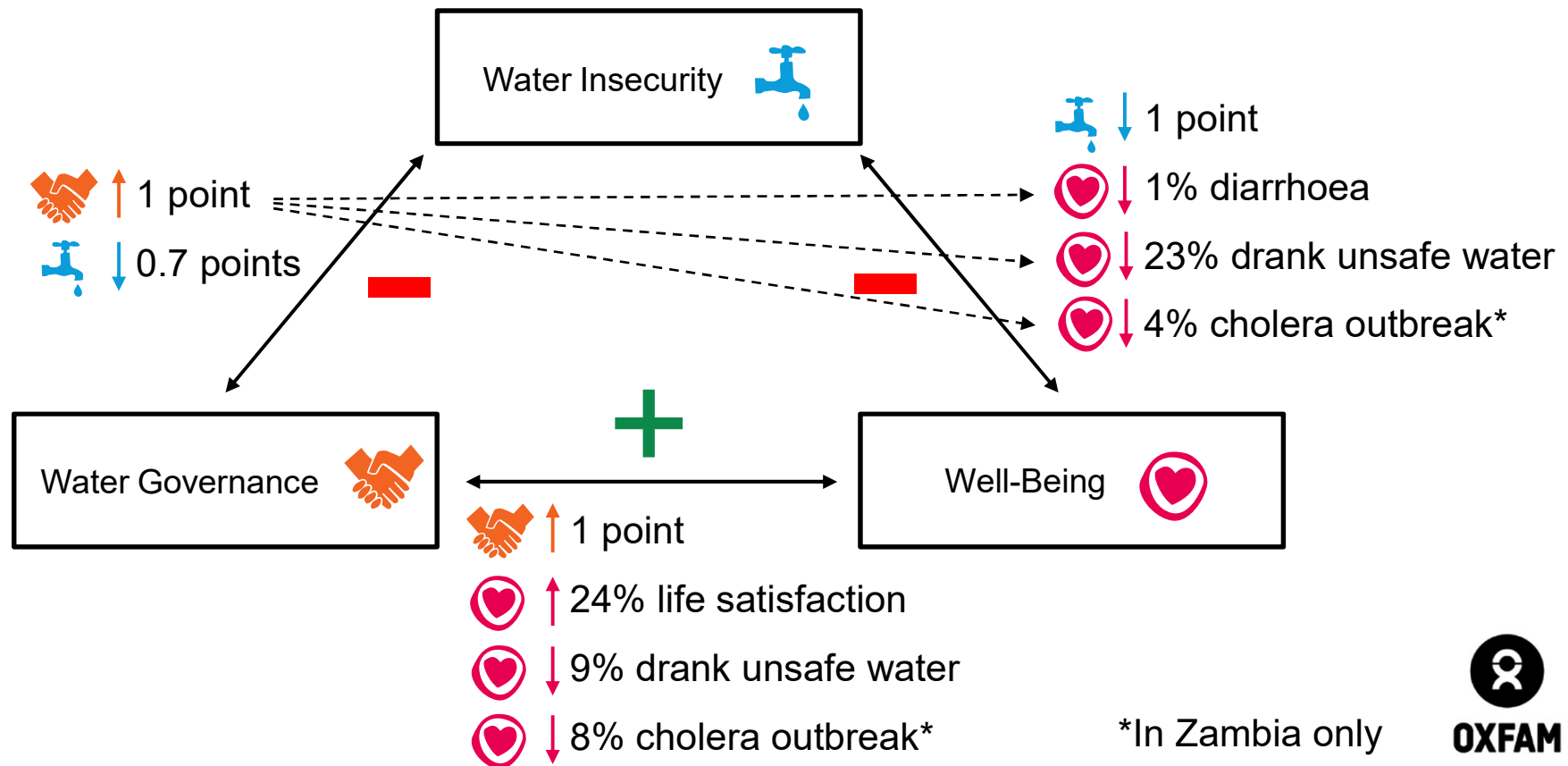
OXFAM'S SUSTAINABLE WATER AND SANITATION INDEX



WHAT DID WE LEARN?

Good Water Governance predicts higher Well-Being

- Directly
- Indirectly through lower Water Insecurity



CONCLUSIONS



- Simple tools helped us better understand how change happens
- HWISE and Water Governance scales are easy to use
